Members of GFWC Virginia are members of the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC), the largest women's volunteer organization in the world. GFWC, an international organization, has a membership of approximately 100,000 with 4,000 clubs in the U.S. plus additional international members.



WHO ARE WE?

We are a volunteer organization uniting 158 clubs in eight districts with 4,434 members willing to help meet the needs of today, and whose purpose is to work cooperatively giving service in our local communities, state and world. Members are at least 18 years of age and participate through both General and Junior Clubs.

Juniorette Clubs are comprised of high school students and sponsored by a federated club who attends their meetings as an advisor.

A Yearbook, published annually, is a handbook for clubwomen – an indispensable tool and source of information to clubs.
